



Assistant/Associate Professor Painting Department

The Cleveland Institute of Art, an undergraduate school of art and design, is seeking an artist with an active exhibition record whose studio practice reflects the breadth and depth of contemporary visual arts issues to fill a full-time, ranked faculty position in the Department of Painting. Three or more years of full-time teaching are required, as well as an MFA or its equivalent.

The Painting Department's BFA program is a part of the Visual Arts and Technologies Environment, and is dedicated to providing students with wide-ranging approaches to their studio practice. The candidate will also participate in teaching the eight core courses required of all Painting, Sculpture, Print Media, Drawing, and Fiber and Material Studies majors. These are theory and practices courses for advanced students. It contributes to the Environment's new, innovative three-year curricula that emphasize an integrated orientation toward media, visual literacy, criticism, and theory. The successful candidate will be capable of teaching traditional painting methods and practices, as well as approaches to contemporary critical, theoretical, and technological issues in painting. While the primary responsibility will be to teach painting methods, she or he should also be able to teach digital skills as applicable to painting, drawing, or print media. All full-time, ranked faculty members actively participate in the curricular development of their respective department, environment, and institution by serving on departmental and school-wide committees and by being active in student advisement.

Applicants must submit a portfolio of current work with no more than 20 examples (CD-ROM, video, DVD), sufficient examples of student work, an artist's statement, a philosophy of teaching, a CV, samples of syllabi, a list of 3 references with contact information, and a SASE for return of materials to:

Employment will begin August 2010. Review of candidates' credentials will begin February 1, 2010 and will continue until the position is filled. Incomplete and online applications will not be reviewed. CIA will be accepting submissions and interviewing candidates at the 2010 College Art Association Conference in Chicago February 11-13th. Academic transcripts and background check authorizations will be required for finalists. The Institute offers a competitive salary and comprehensive benefits package.
