The deliberate maltreatment of a child is an immeasurable act of inhumanity.

Monsters can exist where you least expect them to be. Like many abused and neglected children, I didn't know they would be in my own home. Today, I still cope with the effects of maltreatment.

Knowing that any child can suffer from such incidents — whether similar to mine or possibly even worse — devastates me. I strive to bring change and awareness to this issue. We can break the silence, speak up, and stop the abuse before it's too late.

Maltreatment

When a person legally responsible for the care of a child harms them, or places them in imminent danger of harm by failing to exercise the minimum degree of care.

Abuse

The purposeful and harmful treatment or action towards a child.

Neglect

The intention to not fulfill the basic or necessary needs of a child.

There is a broad knowledge on the signs and treatment of child abuse. Those in close contact with children can fail to identify abuse or disregard it entirely. Educators are an overlooked close contact report source. The lack of valuable preparation and courage results in unnoticed victims.

Primary schools need a customizable and affordable blended training program to educate administration and faculty on child maltreatment.

With this nonprofit organization, schools will learn how to effectively recognize the signs of abuse, report accurately with confidence, understand policies and legalities, and support maltreated children.

- State required mandatory training is not enough.




Goals
